

## THE WORD

November 29, 2020 John 1:1-5,14 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Advent

**Right now we need Advent more than ever. Will you say, “Come, Lord Jesus?”**

How often had God’s people prayed for the Messiah to come? Hosanna! When you read John’s gospel, John wants to introduce you to Jesus. John 20:31, I John 1:1 **Who is Jesus? Jesus is God. “The Word was God.” John 1:1**

### **1. JESUS IS THE WORD (logos) John 1:1,14**

- John was Jewish but was writing in Greek. Hebrew word was imrah.
- How do we know that the Word refers to Jesus? John 1:14, Rev. 19:11-13
- Why did John call Jesus THE WORD? Hebrews 1:1-2
- God wants to reveal Himself to you through Jesus so you can know Him!
- That is amazing grace and amazing love! I Timothy 1:13-16
- Jesus told Philip in John 14:7-9. “He that has seen me, has seen the Father.”
- Jesus said in John 10:30, “I and the Father are one.”

### **2. JESUS THE WORD IS ETERNAL.**

- “In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God...” 1:1
- Don’t think that the life of Jesus began with his birth as a baby.
- Jesus is the great I AM and He is eternal. I Timothy 1:17 “Now to the King eternal...” We respond like Paul in worship. “How Great Thou Art.”
- Or like Thomas said to Jesus, “My Lord and my God.” John 20:28

### **3. JESUS THE WORD IS WITH GOD**

- “And the Word was with God.” 1:1 “He was with God in the beginning.”
- Who would you say is with you, so that you are not alone?
- By saying that Jesus was with God we are talking about relationship.
- How could Jesus be with God and yet be God?
